
## Will Gov. Hicklenlooper's gun control policies actually work?

## President Obama's own experts say "No"



Year and none have obtained appears to have had no effect on crime otherwise. One study (Leig. 2010) The Australia buyback appears to have had no effect on crime otherwise. One study (Leig. 2010) has proven confusing in that its abstract suggests that Australia's gun buyback reduced firearm homicide rates by 80%, but the body of the report finds no effect. Others (Reuter & Mouzas 2003) have used the same data and also found no effect on crime although they also noted that mass shootings appear to have disappeared in Australia. A third study (Chapman et al 2006) using Australian data from 1979 to 2003 shows that the firearm homicide rate was already declining prior to the firearm reforms and that there is no evidence that the new legislation accelerated the declines. This remains true when data through 2007 are added to the analysis (conducted by G. Ridgeway on 1/3/2013 at NIJ).

Governor Hickenlooper recently said he supports so-called "universal" background checks. But even President Obama's own experts say that "effectiveness depends on...requiring gun registration." A mandatory national gun database would be an illegal invasion of privacy unprecedented in our nation's history.

And what about the "large" magazine capacity bans that Hickenlooper and the State Senate are now considering? Obama's experts cited a study that found a "large" magazine ban had "no change in the criminal use of large capacity magazines." The ban will do nothing to end crime.
